



Special Event Contest Rules

General Contest Rules

- Tournament staff will have absolute authority during the contests and can make decisions on any matter or question not specifically covered in the rules.
- Teams are responsible for keeping their players and spectators under control. Misconduct of players, coaches, managers, or spectators can result in penalty, ejection, or forfeit of competition. Spectators must also remain in designated area as determined by Ohio State staff and/or tournament volunteers.

3-Point Contest Rules

- Five (5) shooting locations will be positioned around three-point arc.
- Four (4) of the five (5) racks will contain four (4) basketballs each worth one (1) point. One (1) “money rack” will be designated by the shooter prior to beginning their round.
 - Each made basket on the money rack will be worth two (2) points.
- Each participant will have one (1) minute to shoot as many of the 20 basketballs as they can.
- Participants can choose which corner to start from, but cannot start from the top of the key or either wing.
- A championship round will take place to decide a tiebreaker if necessary.
 - The finalists will run through the same course again, and whoever wins the head-to-head battle will be declared the winner.
- There will be a Men’s Division, Women’s Division, and Unified Division winner.

Slam Dunk Contest Rules

- Each dunker will be limited to three (3) attempts to successfully complete one (1) dunk.
- There will be a panel of 3-5 judges awarding scores from 1 to 10 for the participants based on creativity, style and execution.
- Participants may utilize props and/or other individual(s) during the contest.
- The participants with the top scores will advance to the next round.
 - The number of rounds will be determined based on the number of participants.
- The championship round will consist of two (2) dunks.
 - Individual(s) will have three (3) attempts to complete each dunk.
- The participant with the highest average score in the championship round will be declared the winner.
- A “dunk-off” will be used to decide a tiebreaker if necessary
 - Participants will be permitted one (1) dunk to decide who the winner will be.
- There will be a Men’s Division, Women’s Division, and Unified winner.
